SUPER BOWL LII: INGING By Ryan A. Berenz

What Is This? Super Bowl LII, the NFL's championship game for the 2017 season, is played Feb. 4 at U.S. Bank Stadium in Minneapolis.

Isn't It Cold There? The Feb. 4 temperatures in Minneapolis historically average a low of 9 degrees and a high of 26, but everyone will be nice and cozy inside the climate-controlled confines of U.S. Bank Stadium.

What's LII In Regular Numbers? 52

Is It On TV? Yes, on NBC. Al Michaels calls the game with analyst Cris Collinsworth and reporter Michele Tafoya. NBC wants to remind you that it also airs the Winter Olympics, a.k.a. the Super Bowl of bobsledding.

How Many People Watch It? Insanely many. FOX says Super Bowl LI reached a total audience of 172 million, more than any other program in U.S. TV history.

Who's Playing At Halftime? Pop star Justin Timberlake headlines the halftime spectacle.

Wait. Didn't He ...? Oh, yes he did. It was Timberlake who shocked and horrified the nation at halftime of Super Bowl XXXVIII in 2004 when he removed a piece of Janet Jackson's clothing, exposing most of her right breast to about 143 million TV viewers. This "wardrobe malfunction" resulted in nearly 540,000 complaints to the FCC in what would become the long national nightmare of "Nipplegate." Timberlake is a controversial pick for this year's halftime show, but we're tantalized by a possible Jackson guest appearance.

What Should You Buy? If you're easily swayed by advertisements during Super Bowls, you'll likely soon crave Stella Artois, Avocados from Mexico, Coca-Cola, Doritos, Groupon offers, M&M's, Pringles, and a new Kia and Hyundai with WeatherTech floor mats. A 30-second spot is expected to cost marketers just over \$5 million.

How About Football? There is some in between commercials. Super Bowl LI saw the New England Patriots staging a big comeback for a 34-28 overtime win against the Atlanta Falcons. Expect Super Bowl LII to be much, much less exciting than that.

Not Sad Enough? If you're not already depressed over the outcome of the game or the quantity of cream cheese you consumed, NBC will jerk your tears with a new episode of This Is Us after the Super Bowl.





On Feb. 9, the world will be watching when NBC's Winter Olympics coverage kicks off from PyeongChang, South Korea, with Mike Tirico serving as its new primetime host. Tirico shares why the parade of athletes during the opening ceremony is such a special TV moment, saying, "They are looking at each other and are walking in together, and you are reminded that the title of 'Olympian' stays with them for life." Here, Tirico earns a gold medal for answering our "5 Questions."

If your TV had only three shows on it, what would you be watching? I am going to be really old-time on you: *The Odd Couple*, *Cheers* and *M*A*S*H*.

What three foods do you have to have in your fridge or pantry? There always has to be ketchup. I love ketchup on eggs – I know that it is crazy for some people. I'll go with ketchup, I will go with pineapple and the other "must" is coffee.

Tell us about a moment when you were completely starstruck. I was *this* close, I was in arm's distance of Bruce Springsteen in 2004 at a concert. And that's the only person who I have never met who I want to meet. I've been lucky enough to meet presidents. I've been lucky to meet every great athlete in this generation of sports. I have never met Bruce, and I am dying to meet him.

What is a moment in sports that you will never, ever forget? The one that matters the most to me is a regular-season NFL game at the New Orleans Superdome in 2006, which is the first game in New Orleans after Katrina, and it was New Orleans' symbol to the world that they were open for business again. It always reminds me that sports is more than fun and games; it matters to communities and cities.

Which Olympic event are you most excited to watch?

The downhill skiing. I am in awe of these people. The speed. The daredevil nature. The breathtaking moments they provide, all to be known as the faster skier in the world for four years. It is just the coolest thing to me, and I cannot wait to watch the women's and the men's downhill.

- 2. Instead of paying a monthly fee for your local channels, invest in an over-the-air (OTA) solution for a one-time fee. An OTA antenna will pick up all of the local channels available in your area and deliver crystal-clear HD programming right to your TV. If you have a Hopper-family receiver, you can also purchase an OTA adapter to get local channels integrated right into your DISH guide! For more on OTA products available from DISH, check out our "Product Pick" article on page 10.
- **3.** Refer friends to DISH and earn credits toward your bill. Each referral will earn you \$5 off your bill for 10 months. Visit mydish.com/referafriend for more information. Or log in to your MyDISH account at mydish.com or via the MyDISH app to start referring friends today!
- 4. Do you have DISH receivers in rooms that you and your family don't watch TV in? You can reduce receiver fees by only paying for the receivers that you use. Contact us at mydish.com/chat or 1-800-333-DISH (3474) to discuss options.
- 5. Prevent late fees by enrolling in AutoPay so you pay on time every time. With AutoPay, your payment will be automatically deducted from your checking account or credit card on your billing due date every month. RESOLVE MISSING CHANNEL ISSUES In 2 Steps

If you're missing DISH channels in your programming guide, you can typically resolve the issue via one of two simple steps:

- Someone in your home may have created a Favorites list, so only the channels they watch display in the guide. Or your guide could be displaying channels you don't subscribe to. To check:
 - a. If you have a Hopper, Joey or Wally, press the Guide button on your remote, and then the Options button. What box is highlighted? If "Favorite Channels" or "All Unsubscribed" is selected, that's the culprit behind your missing-channel issue. Highlight and select the "All Subscribed" box and you should see all of your channels back in your guide.
 - b. If you have another receiver, press the Guide button, and then check the list that is displaying at the top of the screen. If you see anything but "My Channels," press the Guide button again, and then select "My Channels" from the list.
- 2. If the above step doesn't resolve the issue, reset your receiver by unplugging it from the electrical outlet for 10 seconds and then plugging it back in. If you have a Hopper and Joey, make sure you reset the Hopper. You can usually identify your receiver's plug by a red tag. Note that the reset process can take up to five minutes to complete.

DISH Joins Forces With Local Schools To Help Those In Need

DISH continuously partners with local schools as part of DISH Cares' ongoing commitment to education.

DISH's Customer Experience Operations team in Tulsa, Okla., works with McClure Elementary School, an institution where 95 percent of students qualify for free- and reducedprice lunch programs. In 2017 alone, the team collected over 3,200 classroom supplies for teachers and adopted 42 students through the McClure Elementary School Angel Tree to ensure they all received gifts for the holidays. "DISH employees are amazing, and we are so thankful to have [them] as our partners," said Charity Clark, McClure Elementary School social worker.

The Tulsa team also works with Partners in Education (PIE), a nonprofit that works year-round to help close the achievement gap for low-income students, reduce dropout rates and assist educators in the Tulsa community.



Similar to the efforts in Tulsa, DISH team members in Cheyenne, Wyo., also joined forces with a local elementary school to support education and continuously partner with the Laramie County School District 1 on various initiatives. Team members gathered 28 bags of school supplies for Laramie-area schoolchildren at the start of the school year. The Cheyenne team also organized an Angel Tree drive of their own and filled two cars with over 80 gifts for underserved children.

Product Pick: **OTA ANTENNA + ADAPTER**

Watch your local broadcast networks with no monthly fees by purchasing an over-the-air (OTA) antenna. If you have a Hopper or Wally, you can also integrate the channels right into your programming guide with DISH's OTA adapter.

Here's how it works: Large towers broadcast local channels wirelessly to an entire city or region. An over-the-air antenna will pick up this signal and deliver crystal-clear HD programming right to your TV. Programming varies depending on the local channels available in your area, but sometimes you can get more local channels than what's available in your DISH package.

DISH has two antenna options available for purchase: indoor and outdoor. The one you'll need will depend on where you live. City dwellers and suburbanites can typically use an indoor antenna. If you live far away from broadcast towers, most often when you live in the country, you might need a larger outdoor antenna to pick up the signal.

DISH has the option to have one of our professional techs come out and install the

antenna for you, along with the OTA adapter if you have a Hopper or Wally. The cost is \$99 if you require an indoor antenna or \$149 for an outdoor antenna. Each additional Hopper or Wally you have in your home requires an OTA adapter, which will run you \$49 for the product plus installation.

Regardless of which option you need, your investment will pay for itself in a year or less without the cost of paying for local channels through DISH. Each subsequent year you will save roughly \$150 or more due to rising costs, which equates to thousands of dollars of savings over a lifetime.

PEAK PERFORMANCE: 2018 VINTER OLYMPICS

It's the high-soaring adrenaline rush of ski jumping. It's the cold calculations of curling. It's the spine-tingling speed of skeleton. It's the power and finesse of figure skating. It's the dizzying heights of freestyle skiing. It's the joy and pride of a place on the podium.

The 2018 PyeongChang Winter Olympics take place in South Korea Feb. 8-25, as the world's most daring athletes on ice and snow seek the glory of gold for their countries.

This special section looks at the top stories of the PyeongChang Games, and when and where to watch the drama unfold.

U.S. FIGURE SKATING'S BEST HOPE

With Gracie Gold taking time away from figure skating to deal with personal health issues, the USA looks to 2017 national champion Karen Chen (pictured), 2010 Olympian Mirai Nagasu and 2018 national champion Bradie Tennell for a medal in the women's competition. Alexa Scimeca Knierim and husband Christopher Knierim are the only U.S. skaters in the pairs competition. The best chance for a medal comes from Nathan Chen, who in December became the first U.S. man in eight years to win the ISU Grand Prix Final.

So C-C-COLD

While unusually warm temperatures were a concern at the 2014 Sochi Games, bitter cold could be a problem at PyeongChang. The region is among the coldest in South Korea. and the Manchurian and Siberian winds blowing over the mountains of North Korea are especially brutal. Organizers are providing raincoats, blankets and heating pads to attendees at the opening and closing ceremonies who will sit for five hours exposed to the elements in the openair Olympic Stadium.

Hockey Left Short-Handed

The Olympic men's hockey tournament will be short on star power, as the NHL declined to send its players to PyeongChang. NHL owners cited the disruption in the season schedule and its effect on players' health as the primary reasons for bowing out, but the International Olympic Committee (IOC) no longer footing the bill for NHL players' travel and accommodations was also a factor. The result is that hockey powerhouses like Canada and the USA will field rosters largely made up of little-known minor leaguers, collegians and players from overseas leagues. If Russia's KHL opts out of sending its players, the talent pool will be diluted even further. It's still the Olympics and a huge honor for the players participating, but this will not be a showcase of the world's best.

In December, the IOC banned Russia from competing in the PyeongChang Games based on the country's extensive statedirected doping and manipulation of the drug-testing process. Dozens of Russian athletes have been handed lifetime bans, and several of Russia's medals from the 2014 Sochi Games have been stripped. The IOC ban won't affect all Russian athletes, however, as athletes who are proved to be clean will be allowed to compete in PyeongChang as an "Olympic Athlete From Russia" (OAR). They will wear an OAR uniform, and the Olympic anthem will be played at any medal ceremonies for Russian athletes.

FOES TURNED FRIENDS

Apolo Ohno Reflects On His Fierce Rivalry With South Korean Speed Skaters. By Kellie Freeze

Eight-time Olympic medalist Apolo Ohno will be at the PyeongChang Olympics – not as a competitor, but as NBC's short track speed skating analyst. "I've competed there, I've lived there, I've trained there, I've had Korean coaches," he says. And after a controversial finish at the 2002 Olympics in Salt Lake City, Ohno found himself the subject of ire. "I was the second most-hated person in Korea," he recalls with a laugh. "Second. No. 1 was Osama bin Laden. Yeah. That's not a joke. ... In 2003, they started making toilet paper with my face on it. I did not receive any royalties from that."

But today, Ohno has a great love for South Korea and great respect for the country's short track skating fanaticism. "It's their marquee sport for the Winter Olympics," he explains. "Without them, I never would have reached the levels of performance that I was at. One in the same, we needed each other, and it made for a great story."

Ohno understands that the media scrutiny that he faced was necessary to elevate his sport. "Without the media, there would be no coverage of short track speed skating," he concedes. "I think media is absolutely critical for all sports, and especially for the ones that are obscure that people don't watch on a daily basis. We are a stick-andball country. We watch basketball, football, baseball. Short track speed skating is not something that people in L.A. do, or people in Florida."

And as the Olympic cycle once again brings attention to his sport, Ohno is glad to, once again, be a part of the action. "I'm excited to kind of bring my voice to the forefront and hopefully give the viewers an inside look into such a crazy, obscure sport where these athletes, wearing Superman outfits, skate around an ice rink going 35, 40 miles an hour, leaning over at these impossible angles."



WILL IT BE A SUPER-V (VICTORY) FOR LINDSEY VONN?

After being sidelined with a knee injury shortly before the 2014 Sochi Games, skiing's downhill darling Lindsey Vonn is back and hoping she's better than ever. In December, the 33-year-old blond bombshell won her 78th World Cup race in Val d'Isère, making her the second-oldest woman to win a World Cup race and inching her closer to becoming the greatest racer who's ever lived. In a career marred by injuries, Vonn needs to beat Sweden's Ingemar Stenmark, who holds the record of 86 World Cup victories, to claim the title. "For me, I feel like I'm going to keep going until I get it," Vonn said. Off the slopes, Vonn has long been grabbing attention on red carpets and at award shows, as well as launching a ski gear collection with her longtime sponsor Under Armour.

PASSING THE TORCH

Bob Costas Hands Olympic Hosting Duties To Mike Tirico. By Kellie Freeze

Since the 1992 Summer Games in Barcelona, Spain, Bob Costas and his dulcet voice have been as much a part of NBC's Olympic coverage as John Williams' venerable musical score. But in February 2017, Costas announced that he was retiring from Olympic duties, and the honor and responsibility of anchoring NBC's primetime coverage was passed figuratively – and literally – to former ESPN anchor Mike Tirico.

"There is a picture that I want to get Bob to sign [of] Bob literally passing a torch – a PyeongChang 2018 torch – to me for the start of the Olympics," laughs Tirico.

Tirico is aware that he's been tasked with filling legendary broadcasting shoes, and says, "You follow a Bob Costas. You don't replace him." Costas' fellow Syracuse alum is excited to bring his own take to the

special assignment. "If you think about what the primetime Olympic host brings, it brings 18 consecutive nights in the living rooms of America," Tirico says. "And there is no other job like that in American television."



PRECIOUS MEDALS

The medals at the PyeongChang Games are inspired by three important aspects of Korean culture. The medals incorporate 3-D shapes from Hangeul, the Korean alphabet. The ribbons are made from Gapsa, a traditional Korean fabric, and the wooden cases borrow curves from the architecture of Korean houses.

CUTTHROAT CURLING

It's no secret that Canadians are serious about curling. Competition at Canada's highest level is so fierce that 2014 gold-medal winners Brad Jacobs and Jennifer Jones won't have a chance to defend their titles. Both teams were eliminated in Olympic trials. The gold-medal mission now falls on the teams led by Kevin Koe and Rachel Homan.

Could Geopolitical Unrest Thwart The Games?

As the 2018 Winter Olympic Games debut in Pyeongchang, just 50 miles from the Demilitarized Zone that separates North and South Korea, the relationship between the two sovereign states has been about as frosty as the mountainous South Korean city's brutal winter weather. Meanwhile, North Korean leader Kim Jong Un and U.S. President **Donald Trump** continue a scary war of words on social media and beyond, as North Korea ramps up its nuclear missile program while annual U.S.-South Korea joint military drills are tentatively on hold until after the Olympics.

With no assurance of a peaceful Games, it's no surprise that tourism and ticket sales have suffered accordingly.

Still, South Korean President Moon Jae-in pointedly invited

North Korea to take part in the Games in an effort to quiet worldwide unease about the potential for violence. Two North Korean figure skaters have qualified, but their participation – a reassuring sign that peace would prevail – was unconfirmed as of presstime.

So how likely is an act of North Korean aggression?

U.S. and Korean security experts believe a major terrorist attack is improbable, but Moon isn't taking chances. According to Reuters, South Korea's Defense Ministry will fortify the Games with 5,000 armed forces personnel, including a specially created and trained SWAT team. The PyeongChang Olympic committee has spent \$17.6

million on screening measures and contracted a private cybersecurity firm to thwart the hackers some think present the biggest threat to the Games going off without a hitch.

The consensus is that, while North Korea will likely make its presence known – in or out of the athletic arena – with all the world's eyes on the divided nation, the athletes and attendees will make it safely home with medals and good memories.

MAKE WAY FOR MIKAELA

2014 Olympic gold medalist and three-time world champion alpine skier Mikaela Shiffrin became the youngest athlete ever to win an Olympic gold in the slalom event, and she'll be a favorite to repeat in PyeongChang. With her young age and tremendous skill, Shiffrin could someday topple teammate Lindsey Vonn's record of 78 World Cup wins.

The **NIGERIAN BOBSLED TEAM** Makes History

If you tuned in to Ellen in early December, you likely got your first look at a trio of the most infectiously energetic athletes to head for PyeongChang. American-born daughters of Nigerian nationals, Seun Adigun, Ngozi Onwumere and Akuoma Omeoga - all track and field stars, too - aren't just the first Nigerian bobsledders ever to make it to the ultimate athletic contest. They were also the first Nigerian athletes ever to gualify for a Winter Olympic Games. Adigun, the team's founder and driver, built the trio's first sled with her own hands, then turned to GoFundMe for the money to make their dream come true. Enough cash flowed in to convince Nigeria to create a governing body for the sport and make them official, then propel the team through all five qualifying races. According to Adigun, most Nigerians don't understand bobsledding ("This is bobsledge?") one bit, but no matter: "They don't care. They just know that the flag is raising high!" The charming Chicago native's own concerns are a bit more dire. "Every time - literally - I cross the finish line, I'm screaming," she told the talk show host. "Like, 'Thank God, we survived!"

SUPER SIBLINGS

Siblings Maia and Alex Shibutani hope to pick up where 2014 U.S. gold medal ice dancers Meryl Davis and Charlie White left off. Alex, 26, and Maia, 23, won bronze at the ISU Grand Prix Final for the second straight year. U.S. Bobsled Team Moves On After Tragedy

The U.S. bobsled community lost an icon in May when Steven Holcomb passed away unexpectedly at age 37. Holcomb was pilot of the "Night Train" four-man bobsled at the 2010 Vancouver Games, which won the USA its first gold medal in the event since 1948.



When Maame Biney was just 6, her doting dad Kweku realized his daughter's over-the-top energy might signal a budding athlete. Not long after, the Bineys – who immigrated to Virginia from Ghana – drove past a local ice-skating rink advertising lessons. Little Maame was game, so Kweku signed her up. His girl proved a natural, and when a coach noticed that she had an exceptional knack for speed, Maame switched from salchows to short track. The rest, as they say, is history. In December, as her jubilant dad waved a "KICK SOME HINEY BINEY!" sign, the joyful 17-year-old with the miles-wide grin finished first in the women's 500-meter Olympic trials, becoming the first black female ever to make the U.S. Olympic speed skating team and one of just three women who will represent the country in short track. True to form, her celebration was as explosive as her signature powerhouse starts. Nodding her head, clapping and pumping her arms in victory, Maame wiped herself out and stayed seated on the ice, laughing along with her fellow competitors as they high, well, *low-*fived her for the win.

Meet SOOHORANG

The official mascot for the PyeongChang Olympic Games is Soohorang, a white tiger who symbolizes trust, strength and protection. Bandabi, a black bear, is the mascot for the Paralympic Games. Both are refreshingly simple and cuddly, unlike some past freakish mascots that gave us nightmares.

Not To Be Confused With ...

Do you know your PyeongChang from your Pyongyang? The South Korean region of Pyeongchang is hosting the Winter Olympics. The North Korean capital city of Pyongyang is the seat of leader Kim Jong Un's oppressive regime. Olympic organizers hoped to alleviate some of the confusion by branding it as the PyeongChang Games with some creative capitalization.

CAN NEW OLYMPIC EVENTS DRAW IN A YOUNGER VIEWERSHIP?

For the 2018 Winter Olympics, the IOC has ratified the inclusion of four new events: "big air" snowboarding and freestyle skiing; mass-start speed skating; and mixed doubles in curling.

Snowboarding, freestyle skiing, speed skating and curling have been Olympic sports for years, but according to *Sports Illustrated*, the IOC decided to include these variations for, among other purposes, "added value; youth appeal; attractiveness for TV, media and the general public; [and] gender equality."

The big air events involve riding a snowboard or skis down a hill and then performing tricks after launching off very large ramps.

Mass-start speed skating, which, as its name implies, features a large number of racers all starting at once, is technically not a stranger to the Olympic Games, although it has only been featured in the quadrennial event once before – in Lake Placid back in 1932.

The mixed doubles curling competition is also fairly self-explanatory: Teams of two players – one male, one female – will be featured, with each team having six stones, rather than the usual eight in other curling events.

RALPH LAUREN ON WARDROBE

Polo Ralph Lauren returns for its sixth Olympics to give U.S. athletes some added style. Athletes will be outfitted for the closing ceremonies in a white down jacket, navy fleece pants and a ski-inspired red-white-and-blue sweater, along with some brown suede boots. Lauren said he used "Polo's iconic and authentic all-American style, infused with a modern sensibility" to create this year's uniform. From Foster Care To Becoming One Of The Greatest Gymnasts Of All Time Simone Biles Shares Her Inspiring **Story.** By Barb Oates

fter 13 years of training, Olympic gold medalist Simone Biles took some time off to catch up on life outside of a gymnasium post her epic 2016 Rio Olympic victories. Our country's most decorated gymnast enjoyed a whirlwind of bucket-list experiences - she met her celebrity crush Zac Efron (along with the Obamas and countless other celebs). she was honored as the 2017 Best Female Athlete at the ESPY Awards, she was a semifinalist in Dancing With the Stars, she released the book Courage to Soar: A Body in Motion, A Life in Balance, and now her book is being translated into a Lifetime original biopic.

Like the book, the film begins with her childhood, following her journey from foster care - she was adopted by her maternal grandfather at age 6 - to her 2016 Olympic triumphs, capturing the highs and heartaches along the way. Biles recently took time out from her 32- to 36-hours-a-week training schedule (she's back in the gym with 2020 on her mind) to chat about her movie and what's next for the 20-yearold superstar.

Tell us about going on set, watching your life played out by actors and reliving everything.

Simone Biles: I got to go one weekend for two days and go on set, and see everyone, and then do some behind-thescenes kind of things. I'm really happy with it, and really excited. They were shooting the Olympic scene, and I could not stop smiling because the arena they had set up - where we competed at in Rio – it looked exactly the same on set. It was kind of like I was back in Rio. It was very emotional, and exciting, and brought back all the feelings.

Your life is so inspirational. What do you want people watching to know about you?

To realize that I'm a normal person just like them, and it doesn't matter where you start from, it's where you go from there and your outlook on everything, and to try to be positive. I want them to realize that I was a kid going through some of the same struggles that they're going through, and it's just not like I was put into this. I had to work for it. I had goals. It took a lot of determination, a lot of sacrifices. Because people don't see the mountains that you have to climb to

see what you've achieved. They only see the outcome.

And speaking of the sacrifices, people also don't realize how difficult it is to be missing out on normal school life.

You don't get to go to the football games, you don't get to go to the prom, the homecoming, and that's like a once-

in-a-lifetime kind of thing, you know? You dream of going to prom, and going to all the school dances, and all of this, and just living out that high-school journey. I was home-schooled, so I didn't get to experience any of that. So I had to sacrifice a lot.

As for the 2020 Olympics?

I mean 2020 would be the ultimate goal, but you just never know what God has planned for you.

Mae Whitman's "Hands Up!" Dramedy Is A Hands-Down Success. By Lori Acken

veryone with money problems, raise your hand. Everyone fed up with your money problems, raise the other hand. Everyone willing to tell someone *else* to stick 'em up to solve your money problems ... well, we don't really want to know. But such is the plight of Annie Marks (Mae Whitman), Beth Boland (Christina Hendricks) and Ruby Hill (Retta), the titular "Good Girls" of NBC's new dramedy from Shondaland alum Jenna Bans.

The ladies are devoted moms, each with her own cross to bear. Immature Annie's responsible ex wants custody of their bullied daughter Sadie (Izzy Stannard), a sweet, sensitive Shiloh Jolie-Pitt doppelgänger. Beth, Annie's suburbanhousewife sister, discovers that her "good provider" is not only shagging his comely young coworker but has run them into financial ruin. And diner waitress Ruby's young daughter needs an astronomically priced medicine to keep her kidney disease at bay. Pushed to the brink, the ladies act on grocery cashier Annie's suggestion that they knock off her workplace to score just enough cash to tide them over till they can make a better – and, you know, *legal* – plan.

Except their haul is far larger than Annie banked on. And it didn't come from peddling pancake mix. And she wasn't as disguised as she thought. And extricating themselves from their *Breaking Bad* moment proves far, far tougher than they planned – testing the trio's mettle, their friendship and their ability to recognize a blessing in disguise.

For the show's premise to work, the chemistry between the ladies playing the Girls must be money, too – and it is. For good reason, says Whitman. The actresses were, er, thick as thieves from the get-go. "We, all three, went out to drinks and dinner and had a million wines and then ended up back at one of our houses," Whitman recalls of their initial meeting, which has since blossomed into regular dates, sleepovers and onset hangouts. "We just sat around and talked until literally the wee hours of the morning. It was an instant connection – and then, somehow, I left Christina's home without my pants. I think I borrowed some of her sweatpants, but all I know is the next day she texted me and was like, 'I mean, your *pants* are here.' I was like, 'Well, you know ... sometimes things happen.' It set up the whole [onscreen] relationship perfectly."

For the 29-year-old Whitman, last seen on TV as Parenthood's Amber Holt, playing a not-quite-grownup grownup is sheer exhilaration. "I had so much fun playing this character because I usually end up playing the responsible, wise-beyond-your-years, brooding teenager that's always making the right choice and is intelligent and wise," she explains. "To be able to play a character who is so brazen and rash and really just intuitive, it's been wonderful. ... It's like everything appeals to her like a video game: The consequences don't really sink in immediately, and there's maybe a little bit of a lack of foresight as far as how things are going to settle after you make these bold choices."

Apt for a gal whose credo is inked into her skin via a massive "All You Need Is ♥" tramp-stamp tattoo.

"I love it so much! That was one of my favorite things when I first read the script," an envious Whitman exclaims. "She's so bubbly and effusive and impulsive and moves truly



from her gut and her heart. If I wasn't an actor, I feel like I would have tattoos and piercings all over my body at this point, because *I* was very impulsive. When you have a lot of energy as a kid, you want to express it somehow and it's not always easy to do that when you don't have healthy outlets."

Which, Whitman says, is why former teen mom Annie is so protective of her own creative girl – the one thing that might save her from herself. "Now that her kid's old enough to be taking care of herself, Annie's having to face all of her decisions and face herself as a *person*, not just as a mom," Whitman says. "It's fun to be able to see that switch, that whenever Sadie needs something, Annie really flips it on and becomes *way* responsible and strong."

And make no mistake, the Good Girls all find something empowering in their newly, if inadvertently, badass ways, keeping viewers on our toes about the empathy we feel – and more importantly when and *why* we feel it – for these ladies.

"The reasons that these women are doing these things are [what] a lot of people in America, in the world, feel right now," Whitman says. "There is a sense of helplessness. People are being backed into corners financially, medically. The world doesn't feel like we're being taken care of or supported in so many ways. I just hope that, in this positive, funny and yet emotional way, maybe we can inspire that strength in people that otherwise feel stuck. Or at least make people feel less alone that are in this situation."

A.P.BIO "It's Always Sunny In Philadelphia" Star Glenn Howerton Is A Teacher Who Refuses To Teach In NBC's New Laugher. By Bella Barbiere

"I've always had a lot of fun playing characters who think they are better than they really are. I think it's just something that I find really funny in real life," Glenn Howerton reveals. The *It's Always Sunny in Philadelphia* star is talking about his new role in NBC's *A.P. Bio.* His character, the vengeful and riotous Jack Griffin, is a disgraced Harvard professor who reluctantly returns to his hometown to teach high-school biology.

"For various reasons, he was passed up for tenure. He believed it was some kind of internal grudge between him and his boss," Howerton explains. "He ends up getting in a fistfight with an 80-year-old man [who kicks his butt], and he gets fired."

With no money to his name, Jack moves back to his hometown of Toledo, Ohio, and accepts a job at his local high school. "I think he is teaching A.P. Biology because that was the only position that was open, but he has no intention of teaching it," Howerton says. "It's a reversal of the movie that you've seen one thousand times where the teacher goes into the classroom of really out-of-control kids who have no interest in learning anything and turns the whole class around."

The real fun begins when Jack realizes his students are actually smart and seizes the opportunity "to basically turn them into his lackeys," Howerton says. "He begins using them to get revenge on people and try to get his dream job, which is head of the philosophy department at Stanford."

But underneath the snark and biting arrogance is a softer side to Jack. "He sort of ends up being a role model in spite of the fact that he's not a role model. ... What I love about Jack is that he doesn't treat kids like they're kids. He does this beautiful thing by saying, 'I'm not going to stand up here and be your babysitter.'"

Even though Jack gets an F at teaching, NBC'S *A.P. Bio* gets an A+ in our books as a fresh laugh-out-loud satire on the teacher-student relationship.

Chip Curry (Jay R. Ferguson) aims high

LIVING BIBLICALLY

Thou Shalt Watch CBS' Feel-Good Sitcom Based On The A.J. Jacobs Book. By Lori Acken

n 2007, A.J. Jacobs charmed believers and doubters alike with *The Year* of *Living Biblically* – the *Esquire* editor's hilarious, insightful attempt to follow the Good Book's 700-plus edicts right down to the letter. And the single-fabric robes. And the sheep. And the impressive, if sort of yucky, beard. And the bemusement of a patient Mrs. Jacobs.

Ten years later, *The Big Bang Theory*'s Johnny Galecki and screenwriter Patrick Walsh (*2 Broke Girls*, *Crashing*) have mined Jacobs' book to create the warm and genuinely funny sitcom *Living Biblically*. The series stars Galecki's pal Jay R. Ferguson (*Mad Men*) as Chip Curry, a 40-ish newspaperman who is inspired to seek a more meaningful existence when, in mere days, his best friend dies and he learns his wife (*Grace and Frankie*'s delightful Lindsey Kraft) is expecting.

Then a Bible mysteriously lands in his shopping basket at the bookstore, and Chip decides it's a celestial sign. Enlisting guidance from his bemused "God Squad," Father Gene (a scenestealing lan Gomez) and Rabbi Gil (David Krumholtz) – interfaith besties who discuss their flocks over cocktails at the neighborhood pub – Chip gets down to the business of being unerringly devout. Beginning with kiboshing the gossip. And "stoning" his adulterous coworker with a decorative pebble.

"On a deeper level, what interested me about the show is the opportunity to do something like it at a time where I think people want to watch characters that are just trying to be good people and find a way to be kinder," the merryfaced Ferguson explains of stepping into Chip's seeker skin. "People are thirsty for that right now." Still, the actor admits, the Biblically gang - which includes Camryn Manheim as Chip's no-nonsense, gay boss and Tony Rock (yes, Chris' brother) as his comical workplace pal - fully accepts that some folks might roll their eyes when Chip immediately reaps the benefits of his newly divine life.

"[Faith] is a very delicate topic," Ferguson offers. "Certainly, we're not out to offend anybody. We're getting stuff from the Bible, yes, but it's also very fundamental rules and values that all people – regardless of whether they are Christians or subscribe to a different religion or to no religion at all – can get behind. The notion of loving thy neighbor and not coveting and 'it's better to give than to receive' are basic, human, life principles that everybody, I believe in their hearts, wants to be practicing."

And while you won't catch Ferguson shepherding in his own backyard, he says that the show's "do good, feel good" message has afforded the cast an appealing self-awareness.

"Lindsey has told me that, since we've been doing the show, it's actually had that effect on her in her real life – and I'd be lying if I said it didn't have an effect on me, as well," Ferguson says. "It's *good* to be reminded of these things that are so easy and simple to do and could have such a huge impact on everybody. The feeling that it gives you, it's *nice*. To simplify it and wrap it up in a nutshell, start just by simply being kind. If you whack away at it and whittle it down to one word, that would be it for me."

The actress and the former NFL star juggle busy schedules as working professionals and advocates while raising four children and sharing their home with Holly's 81-year-old spitfire of a mother.

When we chatted with Holly, she told us, "I really felt like it would be a good positive thing for us to do an inspirational and aspirational reality program with humor and heart," she says. "We have conflict, too, but we resolve it together as a family."

Thanks to Rodney's 16-year career as an NFL quarterback, Holly reveals that when it comes to parenting 20-year-old fraternal twins Rodney Jackson (RJ) and Ryan, and younger sons Robinson and Roman, success comes from treating life like a team sport. "We laugh about it and joke that Rodney's always coming up with these sports analogies: 'You're on the 20-yard line, and you're driving in ..." Holly laughs. "But the reality is – we *are* a team."

The family has always faced challenges as a united front. "When life is tough, you team up, and you huddle up, and you get a game plan, and you execute that game plan together," she says. "We win as a team and lose as a team." In addition to their devotion to their family, Holly and Rodney are also passionate about their charity, the HollyRod Foundation, which helps families impacted by autism and Parkinson's disease. Members of Holly's family have suffered with Parkinson's, and the Peetes have been outspoken advocates for autism awareness ever since RJ was diagnosed with the disorder in 2000.

"What I don't want to portray us as is this perfect entity, because we're certainly not," says Holly. "We have our blemishes just like every other family. We have our family drama, and our conflict, but I just think the one thing that we constantly have to do is resolve our issues as a team, listening to each other, hearing each other, and making sure that everyone in the family gets a voice."

HERE AND NOW This Is US A Family Drama With Serious Edge. By Lori Acken

Last February, HBO thrilled winter-numbed viewers with its star-filled, family-secrets drama *Big Little Lies*. A year later, the network courts hibernators' and bingers' obsession once again with Here and Now, the newest social study from Six Feet Under's Alan Ball. A sort of *This Is Us* for viewers who like their family sagas rated NC-17, Now centers on a multiethnic brood made up of angsty parents - morose philosopher Greg and brittle exhippie Audrey (Tim Robbins and Holly Hunter, crackling with midlife suffering) - and their adopted and biological progeny. Now grown, the adoptees are close but internalize their outsiderness to varying degrees. Ashley (Jerrika Hinton, Grey's Anatomy), adopted from Liberia, is a fashion maven restless in her picture-perfect marriage. Vietnam-born Duc (Raymond Lee, *Mozart in the Jungle*) is a successful life coach with relationship issues of his own. And college student Ramon (Daniel Zovatto), brought home from Colombia and called "Baby Jesus" by his older sibs, is especially protective of teenage Kristen (Sosie Bacon, 13 Reasons Why), Greg and Audrey's only biological child, who is an easygoing stoner with other unique means of dealing with her family's oddball dynamic. On the eve of his dad's birthday celebration, Ramon is beset with visions that worry his inner circle but could connect him to an earnest psychologist in ways that go well beyond the office - and far outside his nervous mother's control. Only the pilot was available to screen at presstime, but Ball's characters, the savvy actors who embody them and a numerologytinged, social-statement story ensure that we'll be there for Here and Now.

ERIC CLAPTON: LIFE IN 12 BARS

Film Spotlights The Highs And Lows Of The Mesmerizing Music Legend. By Eric Kohanik

Eric Clapton's life has been quite a roller-coaster ride. And the 72-year-old music legend isn't afraid to admit it.

In fact, he was keen to shine a spotlight on both the highs and lows of that ride. And that's exactly what happens in *Eric Clapton: Life in 12 Bars*, a mesmerizing two-hour-and-15-minute documentary that makes its TV debut on Showtime.

Directed by Lili Fini Zanuck, the production actually had its world premiere back in September at the 2017 Toronto International Film Festival. I had the

pleasure of moderating a press conference with Clapton and Zanuck the day after the film's debut. The easygoing Clapton was open and sincere as he fielded questions. As for the documentary, that was something in his mind for a few years.

"The idea had been floating around for a little while, with a group of friends, and it wasn't really coming to fruition," Clapton recalled. "I actually tried to assemble it. I got in touch with the people, a couple of friends, with a lot of material. And I knew that there was enough there to make a movie with, but what I didn't want was for there to be a film [to] come out after I died, that I didn't think was any good – I mean, as if I would know. I didn't really want to see it. ... But I wanted to know that it would be OK."

Clapton and Zanuck had worked together on *Rush*, a 1991 movie directed by Zanuck that featured a soundtrack composed by Clapton. So, when Clapton got serious about his idea, he turned to her.

"I don't know any film people at all, really," Clapton explained. "But [there was] one person I know, who I worked with and could trust. And that was Lili. So, two years ago, I asked her if she would save my bacon. And she said yes without any hesitation."

Clapton's story was something that intrigued Zanuck. "I knew he had an interesting life, but I didn't want to make assumptions the way some people do on these things," she said. "I wanted to have it be a journey where I discovered things about Eric that I didn't know."

The journey of *Eric Clapton: Life in 12 Bars* is a captivating one, using some stunning archival resources. According to Zanuck, gathering some of that material was challenging. "This wasn't a period of

time where people, like, whipped out a phone and said, 'Oh, let me have my picture taken with you,'" Zanuck points out. "So, there isn't a lot of stuff. It becomes a lot of detective work. Some of the places where we got the footage was surprising. We were lucky."

The film doesn't pull any punches in telling Clapton's story, either. As well as honoring his numerous musical achievements, it also focuses on the darker sides of his life, including drug and alcohol addictions, personal tragedies and various family struggles.

"I have to say that's one of the remarkable things," Zanuck explains. "I was somewhat concerned that there may be an impression, because we've been friends for so long, that I would whitewash something, or Eric would say, 'Take it out.' And none of that happened because of the trust that we have and the fact that he gave me this responsibility and didn't second-guess me."

The documentary follows the long and winding road that makes up Clapton's career, his personal life and the dozens of bands and legendary musicians who became part of it all. There are some elements in the film that even avid Clapton fans may be surprised to see. Clapton himself says that watching it took him to many moments he had forgotten.

"It's very difficult in places," Clapton admits. "But, overall, I think it was a great thing to see from beginning to end. At one point, when we began it, I didn't really grasp where it was going to be focused. I thought it would be just one area. And then, when I realized that we had to cover everything, I thought, well, I don't know how they're going to do this in less than six hours. But to see it all is pretty overwhelming. A lot of it I don't even remember. But the last section is my favorite part because I look like I've got a smile on my face for the first time in my life."

That smile comes during a segment focusing on a festival supporting the Crossroads Centre Antigua, a rehab clinic that Clapton had founded in 1997 to help people suffering from addictions. Clapton hopes that, by the end of the film, viewers will be both entertained and touched by an important message.

"The underlying theme for me was to show that, from all of that mess, I could still come to be a reasonably well-behaved human being with a sense of responsibility," he said. "So, all of that stuff that went before has brought me to that."

Celebrates Black History Month With A Pair Of Stirring Films. By Lori Acken

WINNIE Feb. 5

In 2004, filmmaker Pascale Lamche debuted Accused #1: Nelson Mandela, documenting 1963's notorious Rivonia Trial in South Africa, which charged 10 leaders in the anti-apartheid movement with sabotage and led to Nelson Mandela's 27-year imprisonment. Thirteen years later, *Winnie*, her thoroughly researched, bold biography of Mandela's equally impassioned former wife, took the independent film circuit by storm.

To craft the intimate portrait, which Lamche calls a "political thriller," she interviewed Winnie Mandela multiple times and also spoke with her intimates and enemies to shape a stirring portrait of a woman undeterred by the worst adversity, but often tailed by controversy. Her battle to liberate South Africa from white supremacy is legendary, but were her frequent legal woes ego-driven and self-inflicted or

the work of secret enemies and an inscrutable national patriarchy?

TELL THEM WE ARE RISING: The Story Of Black Colleges And Universities Feb. 19

Emmy-winning filmmaker Stanley Nelson (Freedom Riders) explores the 150-year history of historically black colleges and universities (HBCUs), and the profound power of higher education to transform lives, advance civil rights and reshape our national identity. Nelson, whose own parents were HBCU grads, uses archival footage, letters, diaries, photos and home movies to bring to life tenacious Americans determined to create colleges that embraced black students, and, in doing so, presented an incubator and national platform for educated and powerful African-American voices that refused to go unheard. "If education is a cornerstone of society, then HBCUs are the groundwork for advancing justice in America," Nelson said in his director's statement. "Thoroughly examining the history of HBCUs not only allowed me to highlight their importance within black communities, but demonstrate how they were instrumental to the formation of protest movements across the United States."

We Turn To Jesus And The Doctor As Season 8 Returns With The Loss Of A Fan Favorite. By Lori Acken

Alexandria's in ashes. The Saviors are free. So, is Negan on top as we rejoin *The Walking Dead* Season 8, as the newly homeless Rick deals with epic heartbreak (see sidebar)? With matters of life and death direr than ever, we ask Jesus – a.k.a. Tom Payne – and our favorite brand-new wino, Dr. Eugene Porter (that's Josh McDermitt), for intel on both sides as "All Out War" continues.

On "Why Carl?! Whyyy?!"

Josh McDermitt: You start to go, "Who has complete immunity on this show?" Carl was always on that list, because at the heart of it, this is a show about a man and his son surviving in the apocalypse. But what does [his death] do to the story? What does that turn Rick into? What does that make [other] people deal with in their own lives? It allows us to explore some really cool places.

Tom Payne: Carl and Jesus are on a similar page in the respect of how we should proceed and the pointlessness of all of it – but Carl is, to many people, the future of the show and the future of life. The world is very different with no children, because there *is* no future.

On The Decimation Of The Sanctuary And Alexandria

McDermitt: People are focused on Alexandria being blown to bits, but I don't think the Sanctuary is in a good place either, even though I *do* feel like they have the upper hand in this situation. We're going to explore a lot of "what's left," you could say. This is a world where resources are finite, and now we're

expending them at a greater rate than we ever have before – and I may or may *not* be talking about bullets and food.

On The Value Of Hilltop's Savior POWs

Payne: This is the first instance where Jesus made a decision which affects everyone else around him. So, when Maggie comes back to the Hilltop and kills the Savior who Jesus saved a few episodes before, he has to accept that. He sees within Maggie an inherent goodness, and he's absolutely there to be a right-hand man, but he'll fight for his beliefs.

McDermitt: It's scary, because [Maggie] can come close to being unhinged. We're not too far out from the deaths of Glenn and Abraham – and she's pregnant. We would hope that she would lean into being this moral compass that the show definitely needs. But she could go just as far in the other direction, and we're starting to see the seedlings of that now.

On Eugene's Wobbly Allegiances

McDermitt: He's been forced to confront the decisions he's made in the past and the ones he wants to make moving forward. When he helps carve a path for Dr. Carson and Gabriel to escape, this is not just, "I'm going to help them escape." This is going to help save Maggie's child. ... [But] he still has the tape [of Dwight's confession]. That may come back; it may not. When Eugene says, "I am Negan," yeah, he's Negan – to Negan. But he's Eugene to Eugene.

Contrary To The Comics, Carl's A Goner

However you feel about the surprise fate of Chandler Riggs' Carl Grimes, "indifferent" probably isn't it. While some fans stayed warm to the moody teen, plenty of other *The Walking Dead* faithful considered Grimes Jr. disposable goods once he evolved from Shane's hat-wearin', frog-chasin' little buckaroo into a rash smartass with a twitchy trigger finger.

In *Dead's* seventh and eighth seasons, Carl wandered in and out of the storyline, but the bits of plot he *had* been given – Negan's dream progeny, pointer-outer of Rick's hypocrisy, introspective peacenik and keeper of Alexandria – allowed even detractors to root for the kid.

And then showrunner Scott Gimple opted to buck the comics, stunning Riggs, the cast and the graphic novel faithful who eagerly awaited Carl-



centric, post "All Out War" storylines that saw the boy mature into a morally upright leader. Carl, a seasoned walkeroffer, somehow took a deadly bite, while toddler sister Judith (who expired along with her mother in print) improbably lives on.

And Riggs, an original cast member, who was just 10 when he joined the show, was suddenly out of a job.

Riggs' livid dad used social media to put both Gimple and AMC on blast before walking back his vitriol toward the folks who made his son a star. Happily, the younger Riggs – who lopped off his flowing "Carl" locks, moved to L.A. and joined the upcoming drug thriller *Inherit the Viper* – sees the silver lining. The 18-year-old told *Entertainment Weekly* that "in terms of typecasting and my career, it's the best move for me."

Playing Ash's daughter is newcomer Arielle Carver-O'Neill, who tells us a little more about this interesting new family dynamic.

A bit of insight on who Brandy is ...

Arielle Carver-O'Neill: Brandy is her own person. She got thrown into this whole world, which, of course, is Ash's domain that she knows nothing about. She gets pushed into the fight against evil completely unprepared, as anyone would be, and in a very, very horrific and traumatic way. ... She's very guarded against anyone new in her life, like Ash.

And learning that Ash (Bruce Campbell) is your father ...

Let's be honest, if you found out that your real father was a chainsaw-handed demon fighter, it would be a hard pill to swallow at first. ... She's a lot like Ash. She's quite stubborn and very strong-willed, and they also have a very similar sense of humor. That being said, they do grow a lot closer throughout the show. ... She inspires him to be the hero that he's never really thought he could be, or he was. And he inspires her to find her own strength.

Any chance Ash is going to get all soft on us?

Oh, I wouldn't say softer. It's certainly still got the same harshness and the horror's still there and the humor's definitely still there. There's just a slightly different side to Ash that everyone gets to see.

Action sequences are easy; it's the breathing that will kill ya ...

The hardest part was actually the breathing. You have to learn ... it's like horror breathing. You know you have to do scared breathing – heavily, but trying to keep it quiet. Sometimes you're almost certain you're going to pass out if you don't do it properly. So, that was actually the hardest part – getting the breathing right.
